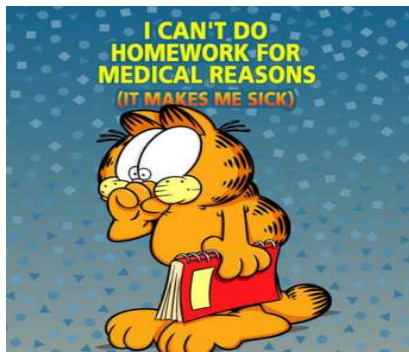
Homework Guidelines

Any work that is copied will result in an automatic, permanent zero for the assignment. This applies to the person who copied as well as the person who allowed the copying to occur.



Absences: If You...

...ARE ABSENT, THEN... It is your responsibility to show me your homework from the day you missed. I understand that you have other classes to make up work for, so I will give you 2 days to show me the assignment. If you do not hand in an assignment after 2 days, then you will earn a zero for that assignment.

...ARE ABSENT ON THE DAY OF A TEST, THEN... You will make an appointment to make up the exam.

Behavior Policy
