Course Outline:

United States History is the history of a great experiment in representative democracy. This year you will learn about the structure and function of your government and the recent history of the United States. The major objective of this course is to provide you with an understanding of the basic principles and cultural heritage that support our form of government so that you can become informed, committed participants in our democracy.

US History and Government will begin around the 1600s during Colonial America and will travel to the current events of our country today. The class will conclude with students taking the New York State US History and Geography Regents examination as as well as a project based assessment.

Content:

- 1. US Geography and Colonial America (1607-1783)
- 2. The Critical Period and the Constitution (1775-1789)
- 3. The Early American Republic (1789-1825)
- 4. The Age of Jackson and Westward Expansion (1824-1853)
- 5. Sectionalism, Civil War, and Reconstruction (1820-1877)
- 6. Closing of the West, Industrialization, and the Gilded Age (1878-1924)
- 7. Progressive Era (1878-1924)
- 8. Imperialism and World War 1 (1898-1918)
- 9. The Roaring 20's (1920-1929)
- 10. The Great Depression and the New Deal (1929-1939)
- 11. World War II (1939-1945)
- 12. Post War America: The Cold War Begins and 1950s Culture (1945-1960)
- 13. The 1960s: JFK, LBJ, Civil Rights and the Vietnam War (1960-1975)
- 14. Social and Economic Changes and Domestic Issues
- 15. The US in a Globalizing World (1990-Present)
- 16. Regents Review

Rules:

Category	% of grade	Description
Homework	40%	assignments that we do not have time to finish in class, or short term assignments which are designed to be done at home.
Classwork	30%	assignments which should be completed in class (DO NOWs, short worksheets, etc)
Assessments	30%	Test, Quizzes, Papers, Long Term assignments
Participation	15%	Raising your hand in class, helping your classmates, being respectful and following other class rules

Late work Policy:

One day or more late: maximum grade possible for that assignment is 70%. A week or more late: Maximum Grade possible for that assignment is 50%
