Course Overview:

Welcome to **Global History and Geography 1!** This course is **year one** of a two-year course that prepares you to take the **New York State Global History and Geography Regents Exam** – a requirement in this state for graduating from high school. As scholars of Global History and Geography, you will learn more about the world. You will learn how to analyze historical events and historical figures to understand the major impacts history has had on our world today. You will also learn where people and places are located on the world map and how this affects our world today.

Class Policies:

1) ATTENDANCE AND MAKE-UP/REVISING WORK POLICY

- **-Lateness:** Arriving to class after the late bell will result in deduction of participation points. Consistent lateness will also result in a call home, conversation with your advisor, and detention.
- **-Excused Absences:** If you are planning to be absent, inform your instructor ahead of time and explain the reason for your absence. An excused absence will NOT result in a deduction of participation points and you will be allowed to turn in any missing work for FULL credit. You are responsible to obtain any work you may have missed from your instructor.
- -Unexcused Absences: if you are absent and you did not inform your instructor, this absence will be considered unexcused and any make-up assignments will only count for HALF credit.
- Any make-up work will only be accepted before the end of its unit.
- ALL essays and written components of exams may be re-done and resubmitted for a higher grade on a case-by-case basis after discussion with your instructor. This ONLY applies to written work that was submitted on time and you have shown consistent effort in class to improve.
- **NOTE: excessive absences, lateness, and producing minimal work/poor-quality work can result in failing the course.
